Some of the news of the past month or so brings me back to the basics and the necessity of giving thanks for God's presence and the coming of the Christ Child. Remember that the Christ Child came because of God's love for us.

There are people in the Merrimack valley of Massachusetts who are lacking heat and ways for cooking. The wildfires in California decimated the town of Paradise as well as other areas. Due to the rains that are coming and there is the fear of mudslides, many still cannot go back to damaged areas even see the charred ruins of their homes. As I write this the wet heavy snow of Tuesday took out trees and power lines New Hampshire towns such as Madison and Grantham.

Despite all that is happening we are seeing people coming together and helping those in need. There were those who made sure that people affected by the wildfires had a Thanksgiving dinner. In Massachusetts Thanksgiving meals were provided for those who whose lives are still in limbo due to the gas explosions. Chester Academy had a 'Turkey Hunt' to provide many of the turkeys for the Chester food pantry.

While I specifically mentioned Thanksgiving events, people are still finding ways to help persons in need. It is amazing how people will come together and give when needs are known.

Let us remember the love of God, which comes to us through the child whose birth we celebrate this month. As we give thanks for that love, may our giving due to that love happen throughout the entire year and not simply between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Winter greeting from your BORF! Seriously, we know it isn't officially winter yet but once again Mother Nature showed her clout by sending many days of cold rain as well as two early snow storms in advance of Thanksgiving! The 4 (yes 4!) scheduled and re-scheduled Work Day cleanups that were meant to focus on the Parsonage were either rained or snowed out! A few helpful people went solo and did some raking and cleanup and we thank them! What this means is that we are going to need an all-out effort in the spring and may need to schedule a few work days to try to get back on track with our physical property needs.

As we believe everyone is aware, the BORF has been working diligently to come up with possible plans and options to address the necessary rehabilitation and restoration needed to save our steeple and preserve and repair the damage caused by water leakage. We have scheduled extra meetings and have met with several experts to give us their opinions in their areas of expertise. These meetings were focused primarily on two separate issues: getting a detailed plan (often referred to as the "playbook") to get the physical work done and conducting a feasibility study to determine how much we could expect to raise and what the time frame would be to fund this project.

There will be a special business meeting after Sunday service on December 2nd to present this information and answer questions. The BORF strongly recommends all members, friends and interested parties to attend. This project may be the responsibility of the BORF to manage....but it will not be successful unless every person who wants to see our beautiful church remain in the center of Chester becomes involved in some way. Please pray for this project and ask God to help each of us to determine what our role and contribution may be.

Chester Academy Student Council thanks Chester Congregational Baptist Church for their generosity to the "Change For Vets" fundraiser conducted last Spring. Through various efforts of the Student Council over the past three years, \$1100 has been donated to the Veterans Heritage Learning Center located at the NH State Veterans Cemetery. The Learning Center is an interactive venue for visitors to explore, make history come alive and realize the significant contributions of NH veterans from the 1600's to the present.

A private ceremony commemorating the opening of the VHLC took place on Nov 1st and Madelyn Moore, a 7th grader at Chester Academy gave a speech on behalf of the Student Council. A footlocker housing a learning center activity for visitors has been dedicated to Chester Academy. The grand opening to the public occurred on Veterans Day, November 11, 2018 with a ribbon cutting ceremony by an Army Air Corps pilot celebrating his 100th birthday.
