So then let's also run the race that is laid out in front of us, since we have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us. Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter. He endured the cross, ignoring the shame, for the sake of the joy that was laid out in front of him, and sat down at the right side of God's throne. Think about the one who endured such opposition from sinners so that you won't be discouraged and you won't give up. (Hebrews 12:1-3 CEB)

This passage from Hebrews reminds us of the need to persevere, to keep going in the midst of difficulties. For those of us who pay attention to races such as the Boston Marathon or the Wason Pond Pounder, we know or watch people who are in these races. Whether it be Heartbreak Hill or going through the cold water at the beginning of May, it takes strength and courage as well as encouragement to continue despite pain and adversity. The writer of this passage writes of those who went before us who are supporting us. The writer tells of the need to get rid of the baggage that trips us up, as well as to fix our eyes on Jesus in order to continue to run the race.

Why is this important to us as a church today? At a congregational meeting on June 10th, the Board of Resources and Finances gave the Conditions and Assessment Report about the church building and the repairs that are needed from Preservation Timber Framing Inc.. In many ways it was discouraging due to the expenses of the work that is needed. On that same day we had the 3rd of 4 meetings to discuss what God is calling us to do as a church.

Putting these two events together was overwhelming. How do we find ways to preserve this building and do ministry at the same time? Where will we find the expertise, energy, and people power in this size church? I am glad that no decisions were made and questions are being asked. We will need to take time to work together to figure this out. This is where focusing on Jesus comes into play. If fix our eyes on Jesus and run, or even walk, one step at a time we can make forward progress through what appears to be an insurmountable task. When we put Jesus at the forefront of our decisions and actions then we can listen to each other, respect each person's opinions, and develop strategies in order to be the hands and feet of Jesus here in Chester. It will not be easy and will take time, but we can persevere.

There are things happening in the church this summer. Many enjoyed our outdoor worship service and ice cream social held on June 24. While most of the congregation could not see the bicyclist riding by whose eyes were on us and not the road, I watched him check us out. Another outdoor service is planned for the 2nd Sunday in September.

We should celebrate the work done on the garden. Vegetables and flowers are growing, being watered and picked. The fence around the garden is completed. Several people contribute to the success of this.

The June Jubilee was a time of hard work, but there was also fellowship. It takes an enormous amount of time and effort so we wonder if it was worth it. Yet between working together, compliments on the food and people finding things at the yard sale, it was a success.

We will gather on July 15th after church to bring together all our discussions about who we are. This time we will explore steps we will begin to take in order to answer God's calling.

This is a reminder. For the month of August worship will have a different structure. For the first two weeks of August the Longmeadow Congregational Church, UCC will join us at **9:30 am** at the church in Chester with the Rev. Ruth Gallot .preaching. For the last two weeks of August the two churches will meet at **9:30am** at the Longmeadow church and I will preach. It will be a great time for the two congregations to worship God together.

Have a great summer and remember that the church is still active through the summer months.



It has been a very busy and interesting late spring/early summer for the BORF, and it doesn't look like we will be doing much relaxing this summer!

On Sunday June 10th after worship service, Jean Gagnon presented the "Preservation Objectives" from the Conditions Assessment received from Preservation Timber Framing. The main initiative was to give the congregation information on the projected cost estimate of \$416,975 for rehabilitation identified as being necessary to preserve our Church building. The most expensive part of this is work that needs to be done on the belfry and tower box. With a Capital fund of approximately \$40,000, we obviously were not in a position to apply for an LCHIP grant for 2018 as we must be able to prove that we can support half of this cost. The BORF has scheduled a meeting to further discuss this with Aaron Sturgis from PTF and to ask more questions and determine if there is a path forward that would allow us a more cost effective way to attack this issue! It needs to be understood that this may be a multi-year, church wide effort that goes beyond the BORF alone! More information will be shared as we try to get possible options. Solutions, plans, committees, etc. will need to be decided by the church body as a whole.

The Church vegetable and flower garden is planted and thriving! We are finding it much easier to work with the stone dust paths instead of wading through grass and weeds! The garden looks quite beautiful and we are getting a lot of positive comments. Many thanks to Herb Rowell for building the beautiful fence surrounding it! Our hope is that this not only feeds many people healthy veggies, but brings us out into the community as a kind group of caring neighbors! Thanks again for all who have contributed financially and with "sweat equity"!

Have a great summer, eat some healthy veggies, be sure to read the conditions assessment report (links are on the Church website at www.chesternhchurch.org), attend any information meeting called by the BORF, and be ready to "think out of the box". Pray that God reveals what His intentions are for us, individually and corporately, as we begin the journey of keeping our beautiful gem preserved for future generations!

MEETING OF NEW 'COMBO' GROUP

Because of few members and shifting responsibilities, *the Board of Missions & The Board of Christian Education and Family Life* have been combined to help each other. We have had two 'combination' meetings now, one with Pastor Linda and one on June 19th.

At our June meeting we first focused on going over the rest of our preparations for the 'Ice Cream Social' that was held on June 24 after a wonderful outdoor worship service! The weather cooperated as it didn't rain until much later, while the cloud cover protected us from any hot sun. It seemed so appropriate for the Pastor to lead us in prayers that included <u>all of God's creation</u> while we were actually worshiping outdoors! We also enjoyed Mark's playing the keyboard

from the back door of the Vestry for the Hymn Sing! When we suggested the Ice Cream Social, we continued the tradition of the Board of Ch. Ed. which hosted a large family event after the 'Children's Sunday' service each year, but the Ice Cream Social was a smaller event that 'fit' the present demographics of our church better. Who knows, maybe this new 'combined group' will be big enough in future years to plan a bigger outdoor event as before, and then add an 'Ice Cream Social' on to it?

We then reviewed requests for support that we had received from agencies and mission projects that provide a critical service to groups that are especially vulnerable, and decided to send a donation to two in N.H. The first was to support the summer mission of *the Salvation Army* to provide meals to children who have depended on free school lunch programs but lose those in the summer. The second was to send a donation to the *N.H. Conference, UCC*, specifically dedicated to a revolving bond fund that has been set up by their *Mission group for Immigrant and Refugee Support* to be used to post bond for immigrants & refugees being held in jail pending a hearing, so that they will be able to better prepare for the hearing, and be able to care for their families. Our neighbor UCC church in Madbury, N.H. has many Indonesian members who were given asylum many years ago, have complied faithfully with all ICE requirements and are employed and active members of the church and community but are now facing arrest and detention. When such a person attends his/her hearing, then the amount of the bond is returned and will be put back into the Revolving Bond Fund to help someone else.

We also talked a little bit about this newly formed, informal partnership of our two boards, and found two areas that overlap. One is Christian Education for adults which is part of what the board of Christian Education tries to offer, not just Sunday School, and providing education about different areas of mission is part of the Mission Board's 'role description'. We looked through some materials that Joanne had that might be of interest and will think more about this, with Pastor Linda's guidance. The other area that overlaps is that of family focused activities that the Board of Christian Ed. & Family Life has offered (remember regular movies?) in an effort to invite & welcome both children and adults in the greater community, while for our Mission Board, there is also a greater focus on local outreach. However, in both these areas we ask for input from everyone, because we need creative ideas!
