May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ be blessed! On account of his vast mercy, he has given us new birth. You have been born anew into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. (1 Peter1:3 CEB)

On Ash Wednesday we began our journey through Lent. It was a time of self-reflection and finding ways to connect with God. We walked with Jesus in the wilderness and talked about his rejection. We saw the hope of renewal with repentance. We understood the love of a father with the story of the son who through his choices was lost and then was welcomed home with a party. An extravagant gift was showered on Jesus out of love. Then we waved palms as we celebrated entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. After this time of joy, our emotions changed to disbelief and concern as we shared a meal together before the breaking of the bread and drinking of the cup on Maundy Thursday. By Friday we were dealing with the pain of the crucifixion. The world changed in a quiet way on Easter Sunday with the Easter Dawn Service celebrating the empty tomb and the sustenance of life found in the garden of the tomb and our own garden. This time we shared breakfast together. The culmination of Resurrection Sunday came with the joyous singing, worshiping, remembering, praying, as we joined in worship and the story of Jesus' resurrection was retold from the Gospel of Mark.

Lent and Easter tend to condense many of the emotions of life into a short period of time. In our own lives there are times when we may feel as though we are wandering and lost. We face major and minor temptations in many facets of life. We celebrate with joy the birth of a baby, but we also mourn the loss of a great grandparent. The rhythms of life vary with each person's experience, but each one of us deals with the good and the bad and the in-between.

Recently I had a conversation with a woman who had great difficulty with the crucifixion. Her pain came from having seen "The Passion of Christ" years ago. The visual portrayal was just too much for her. As my conversation with the woman continued, we moved from the cross to Easter. Because we did go through the agony of the crucifixion, we were able to celebrate the joy of the Resurrection. Even with more minor events in our lives, we often have more appreciation for something we worked hard to do, than we do for something that is extremely easy. We do not want to go through pain, but when we do experience pain, loss, the wilderness, rejection, or bad choices then we understand and appreciate the joy in our lives that comes with healing, love, and finding wholeness. We are able to, as we read in Philippians 4:4 & 5:"Be glad in the Lord always! Again I say, be glad! Let your gentleness show in your treatment of all people."

Resurrection Sunday was and is a great day for celebrating God's working in the world. May we continue to be Easter people as we rejoice in God's love and share that love with others.

April showers bring May flowers or so the poem goes. Spring will come we just have to be patient. Thank you to all who participated in our Maundy Thursday service as we remembered Christ's last supper with his disciples. Thank you to Linda Noyes and Colleen Towle for making delicious soup and to Mary Hamblett for the bread.

Christ's Resurrection was celebrated on Easter Sunday, starting with the Sunrise Service behind the church building. During the service, our Community Garden was blessed. Following that service, we shared breakfast in the Vestry. Although the sun did not

shine, the clouds were breaking up as we worshiped. Those attending the 10:00 a.m. service joined in the ancient greeting "The Lord is risen!" "Christ is risen indeed!" Our choir added to the service.

A big "Thank you" to the choir for continuing to sing through Easter. The choir will not be singing again this spring. If anyone would like to provide special music during the service, please speak to Jean Gagnon. Thank you also to Jean Gagnon and Mary Hamblett for planning and carrying out the worship music this winter.

May's deacon of the month is Teresa Rogers. Teresa has shared with us that she is currently in "Pathways," a UCC learning program and wants to pursue a Masters in Divinity. We want to support her spiritually and financially on her journey.

Many have stepped forward in the prayer shawl ministry! Thank you! Some are learning to crochet and knit, whatever your skill is, the finished shawls are truly appreciated. Yarn is available if you want to give it a try. We just ask you make sure the shawl can go around shoulders, so about 6 feet long and 26 inches wide. See Deb Field for instruction and supplies.

While sanctuary flowers are being coordinated through the church office, we do understand that occasions arise when we might find it too late to let Frances know or we have some flowers we would like to share following an event that was, perhaps, unexpected. Please don't hesitate to bring flowers to church if that is the case. We have wonderful marble topped tables that can display your flowers – and fresh is always better than the artificial arrangements we have. Please check with Frances BEFORE bringing flowers for worship if you would like them in memory of someone and wish it published in the bulletin. Typically flowers are not displayed on the first Sunday of the month as it is always communion Sunday.

The month of April continued to focus on the actions and plans for the Meeting House Preservation Project. The Capital Campaign contract has been signed with David and Patricia William with a goal of raising \$300k. The Capital Campaign Executive Committee has been identified and presented to the Church at a special business meeting that was held after worship on Sunday April 7th. The Chairs and Co-Chairs will be receiving training at a three hour "Organizational Meeting" on Saturday May 4th. After this training the work begins as the task groups are formed under the Executive Committee and we start defining our strategy for success. Please prayerfully consider your response if asked to join a group as we move forward with this very important project.

As we all begin taking advantage of those "few and far between" nice spring days to do our own yard clean up, we must also focus on the Church properties! We were unable to get any significant workdays scheduled last fall due to the rainy weather and the condition of the property grounds attest to that! The first work day is scheduled for this Saturday (4/27) from 8am to noon. Please come on out and help clean up the Church, Vestry, and Parsonage grounds if you are able! Some folks have already begun property clean up, especially in the yard behind the church. Others have stated that they cannot be at the formal work day but have committed to doing some work at a time that better fits their schedule. This is a totally acceptable pro-active approach that is appreciated!

For those who are unable to do this type of physical outdoor work, a group is planning to do some inside cleanup and organization in the Vestry kitchen on the 4/27 workday. More information will be coming on that so please watch for a possible email blast.
