I put all my hope in the Lord. He leaned down to me; he listened to my cry for help. He lifted me out of the pit of death, out of the mud and filth, and set my feet on solid rock. He steadied my legs. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise for our God. Many people will learn of this and be amazed; they will trust the Lord.

(Psalm 40:1-3, CEB)

How many times have we felt as though we are in a bottomless pit where we cannot get out? Events in our lives overwhelm us. These may be in our personal lives, at our jobs, in our church, or even in our recreation. They may be financial, health related, conflicts, misunderstandings, or many other situations. Hearing about shootings, lack of civility, and hatred in this country make us wonder if we can put our hope in the Lord. Whatever the negative may be, it tends to drag us down.

Yet, I find hope in the Psalmist. For the writer of this Psalm recognizes that God does listen and when we are patient God will put a new song on our lips. God is the one in whom we should put our trust.

It is not always easy to trust in God. As we look at what needs to be done to the building, it is overwhelming. The time and energy that needs to be put into the project scares us. Yet God calls us to be a church and will be with us as we work with each other, share with each other, and move out to share with the world. Trusting in God does not let us off the hook for the work which we must do, but we can do it because we know that in the midst of chaos or the pit of death God is with us.

We are entering the time of the year where there is more darkness than sunlight. Daylight Savings Time changed to Eastern Standard Time and darkness begins around 4:30pm. This is the beginning of what seems to be a never ending cycle of holidays. Halloween is over, but now we have Thanksgiving, Advent, Hanukkah, Blue Christmas, Christmas, New Year's Day, Epiphany and other holidays on the horizon. As a church, November is the time of conversation about stewardship and commitment. These are times of celebration and coming together as friends and family. These are times of stress and being overwhelmed. These are times for worshiping and praising God. These are time when people feel alone and try to deal with loss. These are times of high expectations as well as unmet expectations. These are times when we need a solid rock.

As we move through the holidays with all their preparations and celebrations, may we focus on the God who puts a new song in our mouths. As we make difficult decisions and begin together to do some hard work, may we recognize that God is our rock. May we sing a song of praise.



Pumpkins are carved and the church is ready for the Halloween onslaught as we effortlessly slip into November. Preparations are underway for the Christmas in the Village Fair. It's not too early to start gathering your ideas and making some homemade crafts for the fair. Hopefully we'll have a good representation of a variety of items. Please contact Deb Field if you have any ideas about what you might like to make. We will need to plan ahead to have enough space. Decorating the church for Advent will occur on Sunday, November 25<sup>th</sup> after worship following a light lunch. All hands are welcome. Last year's decorating went so quickly because we had many hands.

Autumn is a great time to begin a prayer shawl. Sitting beside your fireplace in the chilly evenings with a nice cup of tea is a nice way to unwind, meditate and mindfully say prayers to the unknown people who will receive such a heartfelt gift. It seems like many need the shawls during the fall, winter and spring. The Prayer Shawl Ministry can always use more knitters or people who crochet. Yarn is available in the church. As autumn graces our beautiful town and state, the scarecrows are out in full force, the leaves are coming down, and the BORF has been doing the necessary planning to communicate and prepare the short term tasks to clean up and button down the properties before winter. This includes a scheduled work day on Saturday October 27<sup>th</sup> (rain date November 3<sup>rd</sup>) where we hope to focus some much needed attention on the landscaping around the Parsonage as well as the standard fall cleanup for all the grounds. We really need a good turnout for this event; even an hour of work helps lighten the load for everyone!

We have contracted the fuel oil price with the town which allows us to get a preferred rate and we are actively working with a few tree companies to determine what the best option is to deal with the aging trees that are dropping limbs on the properties. We also will need to do some patch work on the stone dust in the vegetable gardens as we were in direct line with the run off from torrential rains. We will need some strong backs to haul and rake the stone dust back in place so if you can help, please contact Donna Foote.

As we speak of the 2018 church garden.....we feel it was a big success this year! The veggies and flowers looked great thanks to the generosity of many to enlarge the plot and build the fence. We shared lots of great produce with the church members, friends, townspeople, and food pantry and our Sanctuary was beautified with cut flowers. The culmination of this was our wonderful "Taste of the Garden" event which showcased some delicious bites all made from our veggies! We hope to continue this going forward.

Everyone should be aware of our longer term project that will need to be embraced by the entire church! The BORF is working diligently to formulate a plan to address the necessary rehabilitation and restoration needed to save our beautiful steeple. The special appeal letter we sent out last month raised the necessary funds for an interim measure to stabilize the base of the tower with the goal of making the tower box as weather tight as possible before winter. We thank all who were so generous and we are working to get a schedule set up with the contractor to do this before winter. Our next steps are setting up meetings with people outside of our church who may be resources to help guide us in what will be a large and complex capital campaign project. More information will be forthcoming as we begin looking at both internal and external resources as we begin this journey. Please pray for this project and ask God to help each of us to determine what our role and contribution may be.
